Grade 12s and Returning 12s only → If you're looking at any college or university in Alberta for next year, they'll be opening up their application dates October 1<sup>st</sup>! Create your free "ApplyAlberta" account at [applyalberta.ca](http://applyalberta.ca) to get started. Grades 10 – 12 → Post-Secondary schools visit us throughout the year. So far, we have the following booked:

- University of Alberta – Oct. 5<sup>th</sup> 12pm – 12:45pm in the library
- GPRC – Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> 9am – 3:30pm – Sign up for individual appointments in Student Services.



Grande Prairie Composite High School will be hosting 9 representatives from BC post-secondary institutions Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6pm – 8pm. All grades are welcome and the event is free. You can attend up to 2 presentations, followed by the mini-fair during which you can visit with all representatives.



Grade 12s only → The Loran Scholars Foundation is accepting applications for scholarships until October 17<sup>th</sup> for all school-sponsored applicants (3 max) and October 24<sup>th</sup> for all direct pool applicants. Applicants must have a minimum overall average of 85%. Visit [loranscholar.ca/apply](http://loranscholar.ca/apply) to apply. Awards are \$10 000 for winners annually during their studies, \$5000 for national finalists, and \$2000 for provincial award winners. See Ms. Martin prior to applying if you want to be considered for a school-sponsorship.



Grade 12s only → The Horatio Alger Canadian Scholarship Program is now accepting applications for awards. You need to have the intent to pursue and complete a degree at a post-secondary institution. You can apply at [horatioalger.ca/en/scholarships](http://horatioalger.ca/en/scholarships) for your chance to win up to \$10 000 towards your post-secondary education. A large component of these awards is financial need.



Grades 10 – 12 WISEST is encouraging young women to apply for their SET Conference (Science, Engineering, Technology) November 24<sup>th</sup> in Edmonton, at the University of Alberta.
